The Patriotic view (recap) : looks at (sometimes laudably)  
~~the~~ the righteousness of the document; takes a surface  
level approach. Looks at how America is better because  
of the Declaration of Independence (republican gov't, representative  
resistance of tyranny, etc. Also may look internationally.

1960's (for dominant; other historians knew this all along) - time  
of social rebellion + change. America begins to become  
anti-establishment - notably the civil rights movement  
and women's rights movements start to look at history  
through the lens of race, class, gender etc.

Revisionist view: race, class, gender. Anyone can  
say abolitionist things, but what do they do. It is  
practical? (America says it's for everyone in the 50's,  
but the 60's reveals it is not) Looks at: treatment,  
laws, prejudices, personal values, society

Draw as many direct connections as you can  
between the violations of the British or the Americans
